## **2. Chairman's Report**

Sandy Tyndale-Biscoe, the Hon Chairman, welcomed the delegates and attendees to a damp Leamington and a 5<sup>th</sup> AGM. He reported on the activities of the Charity over the past 3 years. He reminded the audience that it was in this Pump Room two and half years ago that the "Great PSA Debate" was held, where a significant level of consensus was achieved from proponents of both sides of the debate, particularly on the issue of risk-based assessment as a form of screening. As a result the Federation, with Ken Muir of the Warwick Medical School, The Graham Fulford Charitable Trust and David Baxter-Smith have initiated and progressed 'Riskman', a trial, that could change clinical practice within 4 years. The trial had now progressed to the 2<sup>nd</sup> stage and at the end of the first stage, a paper had been published in 'Trends in Urology'.

ST-B introduced Rowena Bartlett, The Federation's recently appointed Development Director; generously funded by Prostate Action for 5 years. Rowena comes to the PCSF with a wealth of experience, having been CEO of Haven, a breast cancer charity. Rowena, duties will include fundraising, defining a strategy to take the PCSF forward: Part of that will include succession planning. A topic that was later mention in the AGM proceedings.

The Helpline, which taken over from PSA is being successfully run by John Coleman running it. Whilst not busy, there is significant usage of the facility, with an average of 6 to 7 call per day sometimes 12.

ST-B thanked Hugh Gunn for his dedication and expertise in the production of the Federation's Newsletter "*Prostate Matters*". The next edition will be dedication to the AGM.

The Chairman then ran briefly through a busy agenda, the theme of which, focused on taking forward *Prostate Risk Assessment*. He concluded his report by thanking all the Trustees and other helpers for all the hard work that they have been putting into making the Federation such a success.
